





The family enjoys views of the surrounding mountains from any one of the cabin's many covered patios and spacious wrap-around porch.

# LUXE LOG CABIN

The sprawling wooded estates built by Gilded Age magnates on the lakeshores of upstate New York inspired a family retreat in the Virginia mountains.

**W**hen Valerie Pickert and her husband Steve began planning for their mountain home, they looked to the Great Camps of upstate New York for inspiration.

"Steve and I both love Blue Ridge log cabin architecture as well as the rustic Adirondack style of construction that dates back to the Great Camp days," says Valerie. "So we tried to combine both for our Virginia home design."

At the beginning of the 20th century, America's most illustrious families—the Vanderbilts, Astors, Guggenheims and Rockefellers—purchased lavish rustic retreats in the Adirondack Mountains.

Sagamore, situated on the shores of Raquette Lake, was home to Alfred G. Vanderbilt and boasted a tennis court, bowling alley, schoolhouse, six guest sleeping cottages and a boathouse. William Avery Rockefeller's camp, called The Point, sits on a 10-acre peninsula in the







deal of reclaimed wood for both the structure and design elements, such as heart pine for the floors and rhododendron for the staircase. The reclaimed materials add touches of whimsy and character to the design and have easily become the homeowners' favorite features of their mountain home.

"We love the twig staircase and the catwalk overlooking the family room," says Valerie. "We also love the built-in bunk beds that were hand made out of standing dead lodgepole pine from Wyoming."


To balance out the natural wood and stone elements, the Pickerts chose modern appliances and fixtures, such as a white farm sink and small wine refrigerator in the kitchen, and a rain showerhead and polished silver faucets in one of the

bathrooms. These modern touches enhance the elegance and sophistication they so admired in the Great Camp estates.

While the interior of the home is impressive, the true heart and soul of the cabin lies beyond the windows and doors. Like the Rockefellers and Vanderbilts of the Gilded Age, Valerie and Steve Pickert and their family enjoy the natural amenities that life in the Blue Ridge Mountains has to offer, from taking in the view from the outdoor fire pit to hiking the numerous trails nearby.

"One of our goals is to hike the majority of the Appalachian Trail in stages over the next 10 years," says Valerie. "Then again, our family loves the cabin and never wants to leave."
